It's a challenging undertaking, but not an impossible one. To incorporate natural lighting into your commercial spaces, start with a few basic design strategies.

Design Strategies for Maximizing Natural Light

Windows aren't your only options for maximizing natural light. Try these simple design strategies in your existing commercial spaces to brighten every room.

Use Reflective Surfaces and Materials

Certain materials and colors excel in bouncing and distributing light. Examples include light-colored walls, light wood floors, and mirrors. These amplify natural light and make a room appear brighter, even when there's little natural light filtering in.

Create Functional Layouts

How you program your space can help or hinder the flow of natural light. Try programming the room to ensure an even distribution of natural light. Removing bulky furniture, adding adjustable window treatments (if needed), and creating open floor plans allow light to flow into every corner.

Add Clear Walls

Trading opaque walls for glass or acrylic walls removes obstructions to natural light, while still providing privacy and necessary breaks in programming. Transparent walls can also create a more welcoming environment and make the space feel more open.

Use Full-Spectrum Natural Lightbulbs

In areas where adding natural light is too much of a challenge, you can mimic its effects with full-spectrum natural lightbulbs. These lightbulbs emit various shades across the color spectrum, making your lighting feel more natural.

Go Minimalist

Less is more when you want to brighten a room. Minimalist designs promote clean lines and remove clutter so light can fill the space.

One example is **Elan Research Park**, a multi-family apartment community in Charlotte. An open second-story exposed floor plan fills this main clubhouse space with natural light. Two-level ceilings allow for beautiful views of the main entry space and let visitors see an open but well-programmed floor plan.
